### Christmas Story

There were so many Santa's at our Christmas party. The room was filled with laughter and warmth for each other. Our 2007 Christmas party began with a delicious dinner which was followed by Al Thornell singing Christmas songs, accompanied by Jean Johnson at the piano. And of course we exchanged gifts. There were 42 gift-givers this year! We were blessed. We also shared unforgettable Christmas stories from our past. Here is my story.

The first time I ever heard the story of Jesus was when I was seven years old. In our small village where I grew up we didn't have a church. A young couple from a nearby city moved to our village. They invited village children into their home in the evening and taught us songs and told us the Christmas story. The first Christmas song I ever learned was "Silent Night, Holy Night". Every evening for about a week, my five year old sister and I walked to get to their place to practice singing this song.

I still remember how quiet the winter night was. The only thing that I could hear was the crunching sound of frozen snow from beneath our footsteps. Our shadows were following us as we walked through snow-covered fields under a full moon on a starry night. As we walked on that night I discovered the meaning of "Silent night and Holy night". Every time I sing that Christmas carol, my mind goes back to the place where I first heard about the child born in Bethlehem.



### "Upcoming Messages"

As we begin the year 2008, we are also beginning two brand new series of messages. Both of these are 13 weeks long and both begin on January 20 -- when I return from Africa.

The name of the upcoming Sunday morning series is "Let the Church hear the Spirit". These 13 messages are taken from the first four chapters of the book of Revelation. In chapter one of this final book in the New Testament we are introduced to the Revelation of Jesus Christ -- the one who is the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end. From chapters two and three, we will listen intently to what the Spirit is saying to the seven churches in Asia. If we pay close attention, we can also learn what the Spirit is saying to First Southern Baptist Church in San Lorenzo. In chapter four we arrive at the throne in Heaven and join in the chorus of "Holy, Holy, Holy". I really look forward to sharing these messages with you straight from God's word. ~ "He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches." [Revelation 2:11]

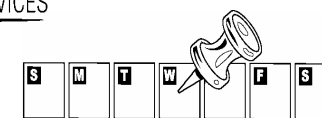

For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ."

Ken will be preaching in the morning service on December 30th, January 6th and January 13th.

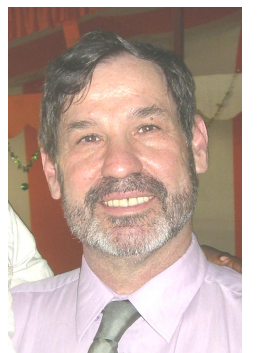
On December 30th in the evening service Ken will be giving his personal testimony.
