2009 East Bay Baptist Men's Retreat by Mike Fortner

This year the Men's retreat was held on board the USS Hornet on October 2 & 3. The Hornet, a WWII Aircraft Carrier, is now decommissioned and permanently anchored in Oakland as a museum. As a Navy Seal, I had the privilege of serving on the Hornet during the early 1960's. Six of us guys from First Southern went aboard: Al Thornell, JJ Blazin, Pete Dal Farro, Ken Day, Jess Taylor, and myself.

We were first taken down to our quarters on the 2nd deck, then to the mess decks for chow. Chow consisted of Chicken and Navy Baked Beans, and salad, with a cookie for dessert. We were escorted to the officer's wardroom for our evening meeting. We sang some songs of worship and praise and then we were introduced to Vance Hunter who was our speaker. He brought a challenging message about "A Few Good Men" from Joshua 14:6-15. Several young men came forward to except Christ as their Savior.

We were then escorted back to our berthing space with lights out at 23:00 hours. At 0700 hours we were awakened for morning chow. After this breakfast, we were escorted back to the wardroom for our morning session. We were challenged again to be Good Men for God. Vance used the time to give us exercises based on what he talked about the night before. In those exercises we met other men that were from other church groups. I pray that each man that went got challenged to be "Good Man for God".

After the session we were able to take tours of various parts of the ship. Some were shown the Navy Brig, others the Navy Seal Locker, the Sick Bay, and the engine room. However due to renovations, I was unable show the guys where I slept when I was living onboard.

Being on board the Hornet brought back lots of memories for me. I was challenged along with others to be a Good Man for Him. I ask that you pray for the six of us to continue to be "Good Men of God" for Jesus.

The Granny Scam

She first felt desperate, then she felt foolish, then victimized, then puzzled, then rattled, but finally she felt grateful.

As I talked with this great-grandmother and listened to her story, she first described her desperation. She said that a stranger from Canada had telephoned her a few days earlier. The man identified himself as a lawyer, calling her by name. Next, he named her grandson saying that he was in jail and was asking her to send him \$2000 for bail. Because of her compassionate heart, she immediately went to her bank and withdrew the money. When she told the bank tellers the purpose of the money, they said "Don't do it". Then she went to Western Union to wire the cash to Canada. They also said, "Don't do it. You might be the victim of a scam". They suggested that she call her grandson who lived in the northwest.

The great-grandmother called her grandson at his workplace and when she heard his voice at the other end of the line, she felt foolish. Of course it was a scam. She telephoned the FBI who explained that the so-called lawyer was really a con artist and that the Granny Scam [as it is called] had recently claimed many elderly victims in the East Bay.

But she was puzzled. She asked me, "How did they know my name and the name of my grandson?" After I explained the ease at which such information could be obtained over the internet, she told me that she still couldn't understand it. She shared that she was so rattled by the experience that she couldn't sleep for the past few nights.

But in the end, she said that she was grateful. She may have lost some sleep, but she didn't lose any money. She then asked me to warn all the "gullible old Christian ladies" about the Granny Scam. So if any of those words describe you, then consider yourself duly warned.

Let's share the burden of hurting members in our church family during this Thanksgiving season. Let's give them some reason to be thankful.

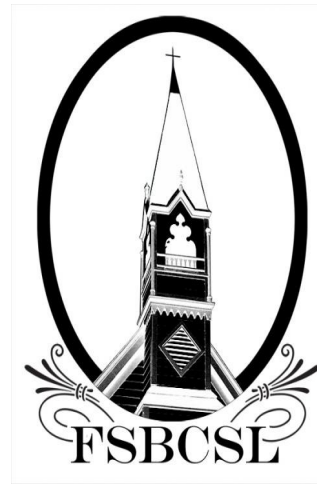

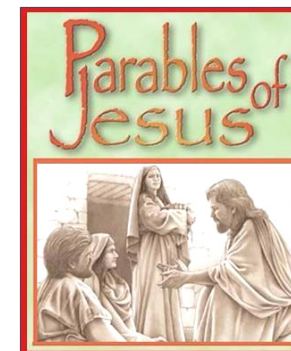

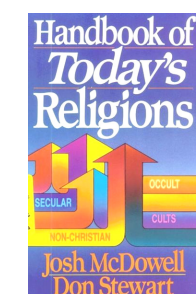
